### Itinerary:

DAY 1: Fly London - Delhi

DAY 2: Transfer to Agra to rest and acclimatise.

DAY 3: Visit Taj Mahal. Bike fitting

DAY 4: Start the challenge through colourful Rajasthan Ride to camp near Bashawar. 71km

DAY 5: Scenic cycling, rural Rajasthan at its best. Stay at Bhadrawadi Palace. 99km

DAY 6: Ride to Pink City of Jaipur. Free time in the afternoon to explore. 70km

DAY 7: Desert scenery, hill top forts. Camp near Sambhar Lake. 80km

DAY 8: Finish ride with celebratory meal in sand dunes outside Pushkar. 67km

DAY 9: Explore India's greatest camel fair in Pushkar. Overnight train to Delhi.

## Seminar on Horse Welfare

Our recently opened Wildlife Section carried out a survey to try to find out the number of horses and horse-owners in South Goa, and to our surprise we discovered there are almost forty.

However we also found that many of these wonderful animals were lacking proper care and management. On 24th October last we held a one-day seminar on Horse Welfare and Veterinary Care.

Leading the day was Dr G S Khandekar, Associate Professor of Surgery at Bombay Veterinary College, Mumbar. We had a full house and a very lively day. Dr Khandekar not only spoke on surgery and horses, but also spent some time answering everyone's questions about their own horses.

All those present were given a booklet on Horse Care, and at the end everyone went away feeling much better informed, and knowing that Dr Jayram would be happy to help and advise them in the future.

Another first for GAWT.

## Wildlife Section

When Sunil Korajkar approached us to set our a Wildlife Section, he had already been working with wildlife for fifteen years, at Green Cross-Goa. We welcomed him on board and he has now set up our **Wildlife Section** at Curchorem, working alongside Dr Jayram and Dr Vishnu, who is a large animal expert, and the team is assisted by Prakash.

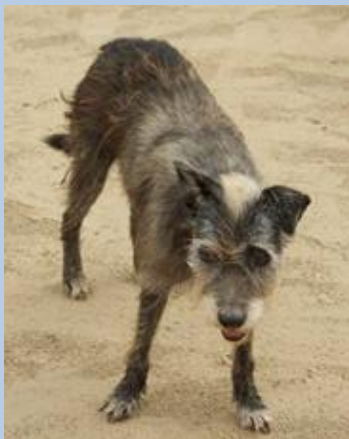
They now deal with the increasing amount of enquiries from farmers, schools and householders on how to deal with unwelcome wildlife visitors

The Team have been catching snakes, including a large python, in and around our shelter at Curchorem. Once caught he takes them with him when he goes into schools, as part of our education programme, to talk to the children about animal welfare and how to look after pets.

As well as this work, he is trained to deal with cruelty case reports, which can be legally quite complex here, with charges or convictions being extremely rare. In these he works together with our Trustees Carmina Fernandes and Sheryl Furtado.

So, a very busy man, and we are just delighted to have him on board.
